The development and creation of the 2015-2020 Strategic Plan forms part of the on-going process of measuring our achievement based on the directions, strategies and benchmarks defined in the 2010-2015, document. Future Directions

- The mathematics results exceeded the target by 2% and significantly surpassed the board results of 77.5%.
- The improved numeracy and problem solving skills results exceed the target by 1%.
- The increased opportunities to practice with previous year's situational problems has resulted in positive results.
- The English results are 3% lower than the target at 97%, whoever surpass the board results of 90%.
- The increase in English literacy specific to competency 2: Reading Comprehension has increased by 1% to 81% but is 1% lower than the target of 82%.
- The French results are on target at 97% and surpassed the board results of 92%.
- The increase in French literacy specific to competency 2: Reading Comprehension has increased by 1% to 80% but is 1% lower than the target of 81%.
- Further analysis is required to determine how we can adapt our teaching to better meet the needs of our students with regards to competency 2 for both English and French.

Future Directions

- Students feeling safe in school results are 6% below target at 79% but the results are 7% higher than the 2015-2017 results.
- The results include the students who say they are not safe in school and the students that have a neutral position, neither agree nor disagree that they feel safe. If we remove the neutral position then only 14.1% of students feel unsafe in school.
- Further analysis is needed to identify how we can make our students feel safe in school.

Future Directions

- The number of specific initiatives for promoting a healthy lifestyle choices are high and we have maintained the same number this year again, as 85% of student participate in these activities throughout the year. This represents 250 of the student population of 298
- Future analysis is needed to reevaluate the target for this directive.

Future Directions

- The Students feeling safe in school results for the boys indicate that the target has been attained with 4.3% of boys feeling unsafe in school. The girls result state that the target has not been attained by 4.8%.
- Results fluctuate greatly from year to year, but the results show a steady increase for the girls and a steady decrease for the boys
 - o 2014-15 Girls 3.6% Boys 14.5%
 - o 2015-16 Girls 6.9% Boys 7.4%
 - o 2016-17 not available
 - o 2017-18 Girls 9.8% Boys 4.3%
- Further analysis is required to determine what is causing the increase in girls feeling unsafe in school, so that we can put measures into place to help decrease the number of girls feeling unsafe in school.

Future Directions

- Students interested and motivated in school results are below the target by 5% at 90%, however they exceed the national average by 19%.
- Further analysis is required to see what measures can be put into place to reach our target of 24% above the national average, resulting in 95% of students being interested and motivated in school.
